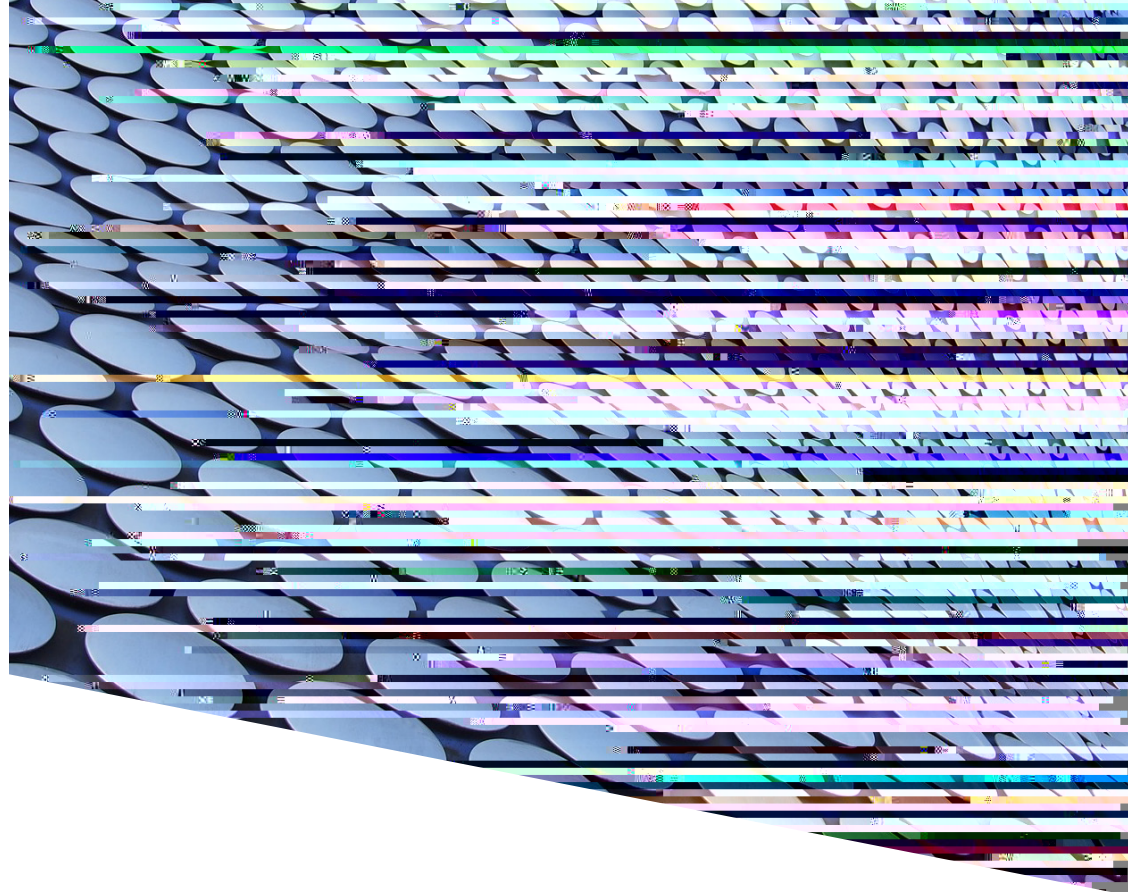
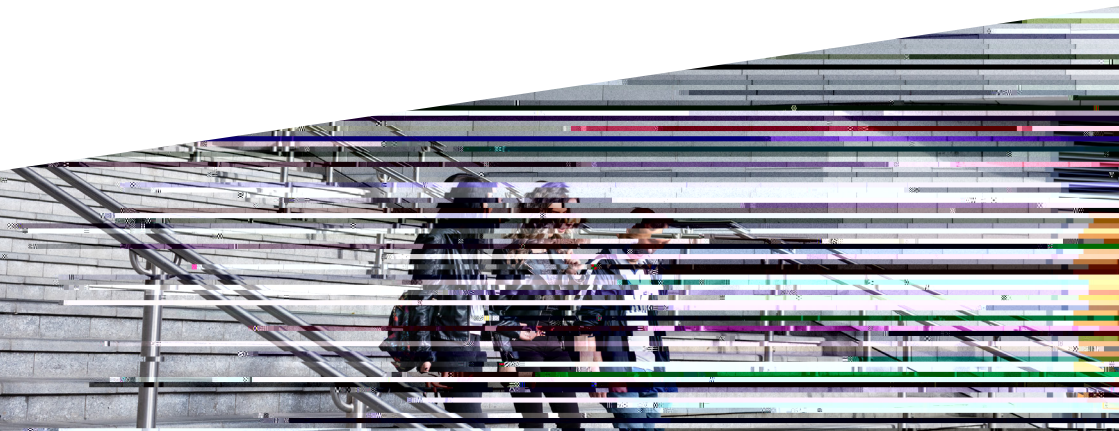
Visit this stunning art deco building home to an art gallery and concert hall. University of Birmingham, B15 2TS
